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"CONCEPTUAL STUDY OF EFFICACY OF SHIRISHADI-VALKALA AGADA IN VISARPA"

ABSTRACT:

Ayurevda have described in detail about skin diseases in terms of classification, diagnosis and general and specific line of treatment. Kushtha is one of the diseases which manifest as skin disease due to Tridosha-prakopa. Visarpa is among the Kshudra-kushtha mentioned in ayurvedic Sanhita which are characterized by Daha, Paka, Raga. Shirishadi-valkala Agada is one of the agada-kalpa which is indicated specially for Visarpa and Daha in Shloka Phalashruti. This Agada is mentioned in Ashtang Sangraha Uttartantra Sthana Vishapratishedha Adhyaya and have 5 herbs and Go Ghrita as its constituents. This article intended to provided collective information of properties of Shirishadi-valkala as a whole as well of properties of individual herbal content with reference to its application in treatment of Visarpa.

INTRODUCTION:

Ayurevda have very unique approach in terms of diagnosis, classification and treatment of skin diseases. Kushtha among skin diseases is one of major group of skin problems which has discussed in detail in various avurvedic texts. It is classified as Maha-kushtha and Kshudra-Kushta broadly. All Kustha have 7 components to manifest as a disease according to Charaka Sanhita. These components are Vata, Pitta and Kapaha Dosha and 4 Dushya namely Twak, Rakta, Mansa and Ambuvaha-strotasa. These components are taken into consideration while treating any Kushtha. Many Agada Kalpa text which also have mentioned in Kushthaghna properities and can be used as part of treatment for Kushtha Chikitsa. Agada Kalpa are fast acting in nature due to potent action of its constituents.

Shirishadi-valkala Agada mentioned in Sangraha Ashtang Vishapratishedha adhyaya. This Agada contains 5 herbal drugs and Go-ghrita. It is especially useful in conditions like visarpa and also has a Trishnahara like properties and Dahahara². Visarpa is classified under Kshudra-Kushtha. Visarpa is described in Sushruta Sanhita³ and Madhavnidana as Kshudrakushtha. Visarpa Kushtha has Pitta Dosha Pradhanata⁴

MATERIAL AND METHOD:

shirishadi-valkala has below 5 herbal contents which are used with Go-ghrita1.Shirisha tvaka 2. Udumbar tvaka 3.
Plaksha tvaka 4. Nyagrodha tvaka 5.
Ashwatha tvaka

Powder of bark (*Valkala*) of these contents are taken in equal quantity. It can be used internally with *ghrita* and locally as *lepa* mixed with *ghrita*

Properties of each constituent:

2.: Shirisha⁵:

Shirisha has madhura, tikta, kashaya rasa, anishna virya, It has properties like Vishahara, shothahara, visarpa-hara, Vranaropaka.

2. Udumbara⁶:

Udumbara has Madhura Kashay rasa; Sheeta, Ruksha Guru Guna; It is Kaphapitta Hara and rakta-dosha-nashaka with properties like Varnya, vranashodhana, vranaropaka

3. Plaksha7:

Plaksha has kashaya rasa; sheet Guna; It is Pitta kapha hara and Rakta pitta shamaka with properties like shotha-hara, vranaropaka, Daha-hara,

4. Nyagrodha (Vata)⁸:

Nyagrodha has Kashaya rasa; sheeta, Guru and ghrahi guna. It is Kapha Pitta Shamaka with properties like varnya, vrana-ropaka, daha-hara and useful in treatment of visarpa, yoniroga

5. Ashwatha (Pipal)⁹:

Ashwatha has Kashay rasa, Sheetaveerya, guru and ruksha Guna; It is Kapha Pitta shamaka, RaktaVikarshamaka with properties like Varnya, vrana-ropaka 6.Go-Ghrita¹⁰:

Go-ghrita has madhura rasa and madhura vipaka, sheet, snigdha guna. It is vata-pitta-kapha shamaka with properties like Kantikara, ojo-vridhdhikara

VISARPA KUSTHA:

Visarpa is characterized by jwara,daha, araktavarnata with shotha and sphota and it spreads from its source to other parts of body¹¹

Dosha- Pitta Pradhan dosha

Dhatu- twacha, mansa, rakta

Visarpa Kushtha has Pitta Dosh Pradhanya and symptoms includes daha, Raaga, paka which predominantly due pitta dosha.

All *kushtha* are *tridoshajanya* hence based on which *dosha* is predominant, the treatment needs to devised¹²

DISCUSSION:

All contents of these *Agada* are *Kapha-Pitta shamaka* and most of the contents are *raktadosha shamaka*. Many of the contents are *vishahara* and pose properties like *laghu Guna* and *sheet veerya* which make this *Agada kalpa* fast in action when used to treat specific conditions. The *visarpa-kushtha* have *pitta Pradhan dosha* with *daha* and *raga* as primary symptoms along

with *paka*. Along with *shodhana chikitska* we need *kalpa* which is *pitta shamaka* and has *dahahara*, *vranaropaka* properties.

CONCLUSION:

Visarpa Kushtha has pitta Pradhan dosha.

Content of shirishadi-valkala agada individually has kapha-pitta shamaka doshaghnata with dahahara, Vranaropaka properties. This agada as single kalpa poses properties which makes it pitta shamaka and raktadoshashamaka. Hence it is potent formulation for treatment of visarpa-Kushtha
